We on the Covenant Committee and Board of Directors are here to protect the beauty and value of ALL the homes in Harvey Crossing. A few of the Madison County laws are: no overnight parking in the streets, no parking on the sidewalks, no basketball goals blocking the sidewalk, no motorized vehicles that DO NOT have a tag are allowed on any street (i.e. golf carts, four-wheelers, motorbikes, etc.). There is also a new county leash law; no pets are allowed to run loose. Chain link cyclone fences are not allowed in Harvey Crossing. Before you put up any fence, please check the Covenants. You cannot build on to your house or add a storage building without approval from the Architectural Review Board. You must have a minimum of two pin oak trees in your front yard. Homes on cul-d-sacs should have one tree, corner lots four trees. (You can have others besides these.) No vehicles, boats or trailers may be parked in your yard. Please read your Covenants. Help us help you!
